## Landmarks in the Life of the Area Heritage Centre

- Opened in June 2000 as a joint project between North Wilts District Council and Corsham Town Council
- Threatened with closure in May 2006 when NWDC opted out of running tourist information centres and Corsham Town Council decided against taking on sole responsibility
- Summer 2006: Over 800 local people signed a petition to save the Heritage Centre
- July 2006: Corsham Area Development Trust (CADT) formed as a 'not for private profit company' to take on the running of the Tourist Information and Heritage Centre (TI&HC)
- October 2006: CADT begins running the TI&HC under the terms of an Agreement lasting 3 years
- Early 2007: NWDC funds a major refurbishment which makes better use of the space and provides wheelchair access
- 2009: The cost to the public purse has been halved while visitor numbers and bed bookings dramatically increase, bringing welcome benefit to the local economy
- 2010 onwards: The Centre continues to thrive, despite budget cuts, bringing increased benefit to the local economy. The decision has been made to widen the focus of the Centre to include the area surrounding Corsham and to reemphasise the importance of the Heritage Centre with the Information Centre providing administration and support. The name has been changed to 'Corsham Area Heritage and Information Centre'.
- 2011 onwards: Plans are in place to establish the Friends of the Corsham Area Heritage Centre with the aim of enhancing understanding of the history of Corsham and its surrounding area by developing the Heritage Centre.

The Corsham Area Heritage and Information Centre is located in the High Street in what was once the town house of a wealthy C18th clothier, William Arnold.

Exhibits in the Heritage Rooms illustrate how the wealth of Corsham was based on two industries first the wool trade and later the stone mining industry. Changing displays highlight other aspects of Corsham area's past and present. The local community is now encouraged to lead the search for the many intriguing stories of the social and economic development of the area.

The Information Centre staff and volunteers have a wealth of local knowledge which enables them to support the Area Heritage Centre while meeting the needs of local residents and businesses, and offering attractions and services to encourage visitors to the area.



In 2010 the Centre provided assistance to 18,000 users and booked 300 bed-nights of local accommodation in the process.

Website visitor hit-rate has already exceeded 16,500 p.a.
