## LATEST NEWS - NEW OPENING HOURS

**W**iltshire Council, our main source of direct financial assistance, has progressively reduced our funding - from £35,000 three years ago, to a seriously restrictive £18,750 from April 2010.

In attempting to accommodate this reduction and maintain our service, it has been necessary to amend the opening hours of the Centre to 10.00am to 4.00pm Monday to Saturday and to increase our reliance on volunteers over this extended selling-opportunity period.

We are fortunate that this direct financial funding is not our only source of assistance from local authorities. We also benefit from the free use of part of Arnold House, through an agreement with Corsham Town Council. This is extremely valuable to us, as having to pay even minimal rent for this space would threaten our very survival.

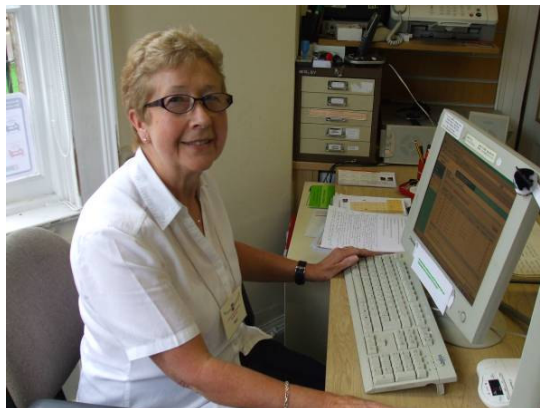

## WHY "ARNOLD'S" NEWS?

**O**ur newsletter takes its name from William Arnold, Corsham's 17th Century clothier (pictured right).

William's family were originally from Lacock. His marriage to Jane Gibbons, daughter of a wealthy Corsham merchant, brought him to the town where they made their home in the building that now houses the CI&HC.

Arnold House later became the home of the Pictor family, who owned a stone mining business in Corsham at the height of the 'stone boom'. In 1959, the last known member of the family to remain in Corsham, Dorothy Joan Pictor, passed away, bequeathing Arnold House to the (then) Parish Council to be used for the benefit of local people.

In addition to the rooms occupied by the Centre, there are two residential flats in the building, plus a meeting room used by the 'Miss Pictor Club' and other local organisations run by the people of the town.

## GET INVOLVED

The day-to-day running of the Centre is covered very efficiently by the managers, leaving the committee members to make policy decisions and to seek to ensure the future of the Trust.
